

NATIVE AMERICAN HEALTH NEEDS DATA REPORT

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PROJECT DESRIPTION

Panhandle Public Health District in collaboration and partnership with Nebraska Minority Resource Center began the process of collecting data in September of 2023 to understand better the health needs of Native Americans in the Panhandle of Nebraska.

Through the process, the Nebraska Minority Resource Center and Panhandle Public Health District conducted three separate focus groups. One in Sheridan County on September 22nd, 2023, one in Dawes County on December 16th, 2023, and the third in Box Butte County on June 13th, 2024. The questions prepared for the focus groups aligned with the local hospital's Community Health Improvement Plan priority areas to help us determine how those facilities could better serve the local Native American Population in alignment with their current priorities.

Two separate surveys were also circulated as a part of the data collection process. To target a high response rate from the Native American population, all focus group participants and the clients and customers of NMRC filled out the surveys. The first survey was a well-being assessment intended to gauge the current and anticipated well-being of the respondents. 117 responses were collected from the well-being assessment. The second survey was a Native American Acculturation Survey utilized to assess the respondent's cultural identity and help us to better understand the current cultural beliefs and values of the Native American Population in the Panhandle of Nebraska.

FOCUS GROUP DATA

Focus Group Findings

As you read through the focus group strengths, weaknesses and needs you may notice contradictions. This is because the three counties included in the assessment are geographically diverse, thus needs in one community may be a strength in another community, and vice versa. The focus group data is broken out by County as the questions asked in each focus group varied slightly based on the local hospital's community health improvement plan priorities.

Sheridan County

Things that are comfortable/uncomfortable about living in the community

Positive

- Easy access to doctors
- A strong sense of community
- The police presence is friendly and their ability to resolve conflict is high
- There is a place to go to get the resources needed and to know what is available

Negative

Residents have to travel long distances to see specialists when needed

Things that would increase the comfort of living in Sheridan County

- Better public transportation options
- · More health and wellness awareness and activities for youth

<u>Useful forms of transportation or transportation needs</u>

Positive

- The school has busses for kids to get to and from school
- Most things are within walking distance and the community is a safe place to walk

Negative

- There are no public transportation options in town or for out-of-town transit
- Individuals rely heavily on neighbors and friends for transport
- Cars often don't stop for pedestrians in the downtown area
- It is hard to access transit from the Reservation to Rapid City because you have to be to Pine Ridge by 7am to catch the bus

Needs/Wants

- Scooters for inner city transit like bigger cities
- A bus that runs between Gordon & Rushville several times a day
- A bus that runs from Gordon or Rushville to IHS
- A bus that goes to larger cities like Rapid City or Scottsbluff

Mental health resources

Positive

- Talking circles
- Telehealth counseling through IHS
- The Behavioral Health Region office in Rushville

Negative

- Residents have to travel long distances for mental health services
- There is no more AA or NA
- o it is hard to take time off work for mental health appointments
- It is hard to find counselors accepting new patients
- Wait times for mental health providers are very long

Needs/Wants

- Talking circles back
- A place to host and resources for AA and NA
- More/Better public transportation options

If resources were to expand, what resources would be most helpful?

Positive

 It has been nice in the past to have Native traditions included in services (talking circles)

Negative

- There is a belief that burning sage smells like marijuana and may be confused with that
- There could be more education on how sage is used in the Native culture
- Negative youth views of Sheridan County

Needs/Wants

- AA/NA meetings
- Talking circles with traditions like prayer
- More cultural events to help with connectedness
- Resources for youth to get involved
- · Education on traditional medicines and health
- Cultural events and education for youth

Struggles with childcare

Positive

 The respite program through the state for special needs kids that offers reimbursement for care to a family member or friend is very helpful

Negative

- Daycares are full
- Waiting lists for daycares are very long
- Childcare through school programs are out of Rushville or Chadron
- The hospital has care but tailors to Hospital staff
- There is no drop in care for short periods of time
- There are no services for special needs kids
- There are a lack of facilities or in home day cares
- When there are openings, they are very expensive
- Extreme lack of care for infants
- · Lack of social supports to help watch kids

Need

- · Staff at facilities that are trained in caring for special needs kids
- Training for people in the community to get trained in childcare to open up more options

Dawes County

Things that are comfortable / uncomfortable about living in the community

Positive

- Church
- Safe communities
- Positive interactions with law enforcement
- Stable place to live with a good school system

Negative

- Native American is no longer an option to select under race on hospital forms
- It is challenging to get services and resources like EBT
- It is hard to get to church due to lack of transportation options

Things that would increase the comfort of living in Dawes County

Positive

 Management at Walmart are willing to build relationships with Natives

- Close relationships with individuals of different cultures in some situations, but not all
- The community is making an effort to incorporate Native American meals for all individuals to experience the culture

Negative

- Some store workers assume Native Americans are going to steal something and treat them differently while shopping
- The more "Native" you look, the worse it is while shopping
- There is no consistency with drug enforcement
- People are not friendly toward Natives and Native American's are ashamed to be Native American

Needs/Wants

- Less drug activity locally & on the reservation
- More cultural activities such as pow wows, Native American meals and educational opportunities for the general public on culture
- More opportunities for the youth to learn about their culture

<u>Useful forms of transportation or transportation needs</u>

Positive

The Handy Bus in Chadron works for some people

Negative

- You have to pay one dollar every time you ride the Handy Bus, no matter what
- The Handy Bus is not handicap or elderly accessible (it used to be but their lift broke and has not been fixed)
- The Handy Bus picks individuals up in the order they call so you may be waiting for a long time depending on how many people called before you
- There is no transit to IHS in Pine Ridge
- If you need to be taken by ambulance to the hospital, there is no way for you to get home once you are discharged

Needs/Wants

- Local taxi services
- Bike rental or share options
- A van or bus that will take community members to IHS or Rapid City for medical appointments
- Regular bus stops with a regular schedule and a bus that is handicap accessible

Mental health resources

Positive

 Telehealth is convenient and saves a lot of travel time when it is available, however it is not available for all specialists

Negative

- All mental health services are located in Gordon so you have to travel or find gas money
- If you need to be admitted to a behavioral health facility, you are taken to the eastern part of the state and left to find your own way home when discharged
- There is no long term or follow up care for mental health issues, if you are admitted, you are discharged in a few days
- o It seems like local resources are offering band aid or temporary fixes
- The wait times seem especially long for children needing behavioral health assessments

Need

- Better consistency in mental health services for children
- More telehealth options for mental health services
- More local dentists that accept Medicaid/Medicare

Access to safe and affordable housing in Dawes County

Negative

- There is not enough available housing or rental options in Dawes County
- Landlords don't want to rent or seem to avoid renting to Native Americans
- Landlords do not take responsibility when something breaks and needs fixed
- Fixes often take many months to be repaired
- There are a lot of loopholes to jump through in order to obtain section
 8 vouchers and nobody locally to answer questions
- There is no prompt notice from landlords and they are quick to evict if tenants are late on their rent

Box Butte County

Things that are comfortable/uncomfortable about living in the community

Positive

Knowing there is support available if needed

Negative

 Not many natives feel comfortable because there is still a lot of prejudice toward Native Americans

Things that would increase the comfort of living in Box Butte County

- Increased privacy and hospital confidentiality
- No more stereotypes toward Native Americans
- Stop making assumptions about the Native American population as a whole based on the actions of a single person
- Availability of insurance for local healthcare

<u>Useful forms of transportation or transportation needs</u>

Positive

- Mainly use personal vehicles for transportation needs
- Local churches are willing to assist with transportation when available
- Walking is an option in the community

Negative

• Bus fares in Box Butte County are too high

Mental health resources

Positive

- There is a Native American center in Alliance
- There is a sweat lodge
- There is a Native American church and Native American groups

Negative

- The Native American center seems to be run for personal gain rather than help and growth of others
- Many landlords do not want to rent buildings to Natives to use for Native businesses or centers
- There are long wait times for services

Needs/wants

· A Native American counseling group for adults and teens

- A building to use for counseling and connecting Native Americans to the services they need
- A certified Native American counselor
- A person in Box Butte County who can help connect Native Americans to services
- Housing help and more available housing for Native Americans

Sources of Information in the community

Positive

- Social Media
- Signs
- Flyers (Bomgarrs, Chamber of Commerce, Social Media, Trueman Center)

Negative

- There is no standard place people put flyers, you have to hunt for them
- it is hard to find resources when you need them

Needs/Wants

- More word-of-mouth spreading of information
- Native American counselors or resource directors
- A designated place for Native Americans to get help finding resources

Increased trust and comfort with local hospital

Negative

- There is a lot of prejudice toward Native Americans at the Hospital
- o It always feels like a bother when seeking care
- Many people don't seek care because of the way they feel when they do
- it feels like healthcare workers are always searching for something wrong or a reason to call CPS
- Don't feel comfortable seeking services from Native Futures because it feels like the services and programs are only for one family

Need

- Native American nurses and doctors
- Education to healthcare staff on what services are available to Native Americans through IHS
- An after-hours clinic so individuals don't have to rely on the Emergency Room

Other resources outside of Mental Health and Hospitals that would make things easier

Positive

 The program at the Knights Museum on Crazy Horse to help with education on the Native American Culture

Negative

- There is no place to have a funeral
- Most people are on their own when it comes to finding resources
- There is a lot of division in the community
- Youth are exposed to drugs or alcohol at an early age
- The YMCA is very expensive and Native Americans are treated poorly there
- Native Americans are not attending events in the community meant to increase awareness about their own culture

Needs/Wants

- A building for a Native American Center
- Someone to connect and guide individuals to resources, not only in Box
 Butte County, but across the state if they are not available locally
- More youth involvement
- More Native American education in schools
- More awareness in the community




The following data shows the ratings each respondent gave about their connection to their Native American Culture. The areas where respondents indicated the least connection to their Native American Culture are:

What language do you read in?




What language do you write in?





What language do you think in?





What language can you speak?





What language do you prefer?




This set of questions deals with Native American identify. Most respondents identified themselves as primarily Native American.

How do you identify yourself?



How did your mother identify herself?




How did your father identify herself?



What was the Ethnic Origin of your Friends as a Child prior to Age 6?




What was the Ethnic Origin of your Friends as a Child Age 6 to 18?



Who do you Associate with Now in your Community?




Where were you born?





Where were you raised?





What Contact have you had with Native American Communities?



How much pride do you have in Native American Culture and Heritage?




Do you participate in Native American traditions, ceremonies, occasions and so on?





How would you rate yourself?




This set of questions deals with the type of art respondents consume. Respondents primarily indicated that they consumed mixed cultural art.

What Movies do you Prefer?





What Music do you Prefer?







What Music do you Prefer?




What foods do you prefer?





Native American Wellbeing Survey



Which step of the ladder do you envision yourself standing on in 5 years?




Do you need help with any of the following?





2024 Focus Group Guide for Native American Health Needs Focus Group

We would like to talk with you today about your community and your impressions of American Indian Health Services and health needs. Everyone's opinion is important, so I want to make sure that all get a chance to talk. Feel free to respond to each other and give your opinion even if it differs from your neighbor. Occasionally I may interrupt to move on to the next question, but I will do so just to make sure we cover all the topics that we want to talk about today. It will never mean that I do not think what you are saying is important.

Let's take a minute to introduce ourselves before we get started. Could you please tell everyone your name and how long you have lived in name of community or health district? Focus Group Ground Rules We have a lot to cover, so we will all need to do a few things to get our jobs done:

- 1. Talk one at a time and in a voice at least as loud as mine.
- 2. We need to hear from every one of you during the discussion even though each person does not have to answer every question.
- 3. Feel free to respond to what has been said by talking to me or to any other member of the group. That works best when we avoid side conversations and talk one at a time.
- 4. There are no wrong answers, just different opinions. We are looking for different points of view. So just say what is on your mind.
- 5. We do have a lot to cover, so you may all be interrupted at some point in order to keep moving and to avoid running out of time.
- 6. We value your opinions, both positive and negative, and we hope you choose to express them during the discussion.
